Water Power Week in Washington

- Record participation (590 registrants, 133 speakers, \$117k net profit)

Clean Currents

- Almost \$1.5MM already raised; 75% of budgeted (mostly from exhibits)
- 187 exhibitors already confirmed
- Call for speakers resulted in 112 submissions
- Continued industry excitement

Regional Meetings

- Record attendance at Midwest Regional Meeting in WI
- Northeast Regional Meeting Springfield, MA July 25-26
- Already exceeded annual revenue target




DOE grant (\$3.7M over 2 years, spread between 12+ groups) should accelerate discussions

Table: Annual Inflation Rates

To find annual inflation rates for a calendar year, look to the December column. For instance, the inflation rate in 2022 was 6.5%. Meanwhile, the "Ave" column shows the average inflation rate for each year <u>using CPI data</u>. In 2022, the average inflation rate was 8.0%. These average rates are published by the BLS but are rarely discussed in the news media, taking a back seat to the actual rate of inflation for a given calendar year.


