- Eels are high in various vitamins and minerals
- Excellent indicators of habitat integrity and can signal the vulnerability of other species within an ecosystem






Dam Construction Consequences

- Everywhere eels existed historically, Indigenous groups would have used eels

- When eels disappear from a region, an important piece of inter-generational knowledge stops being transferred
